couch - and have a nice big

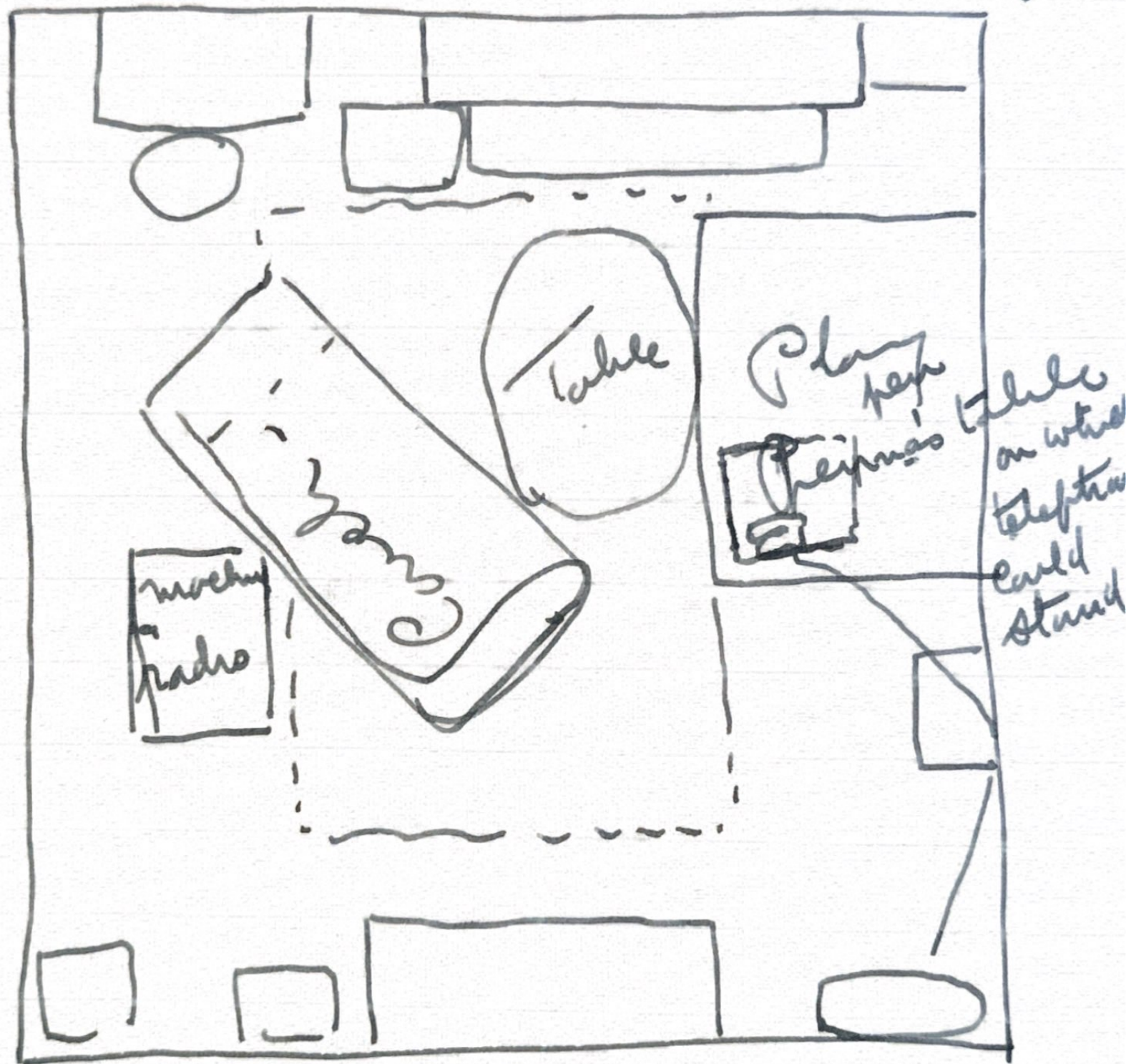
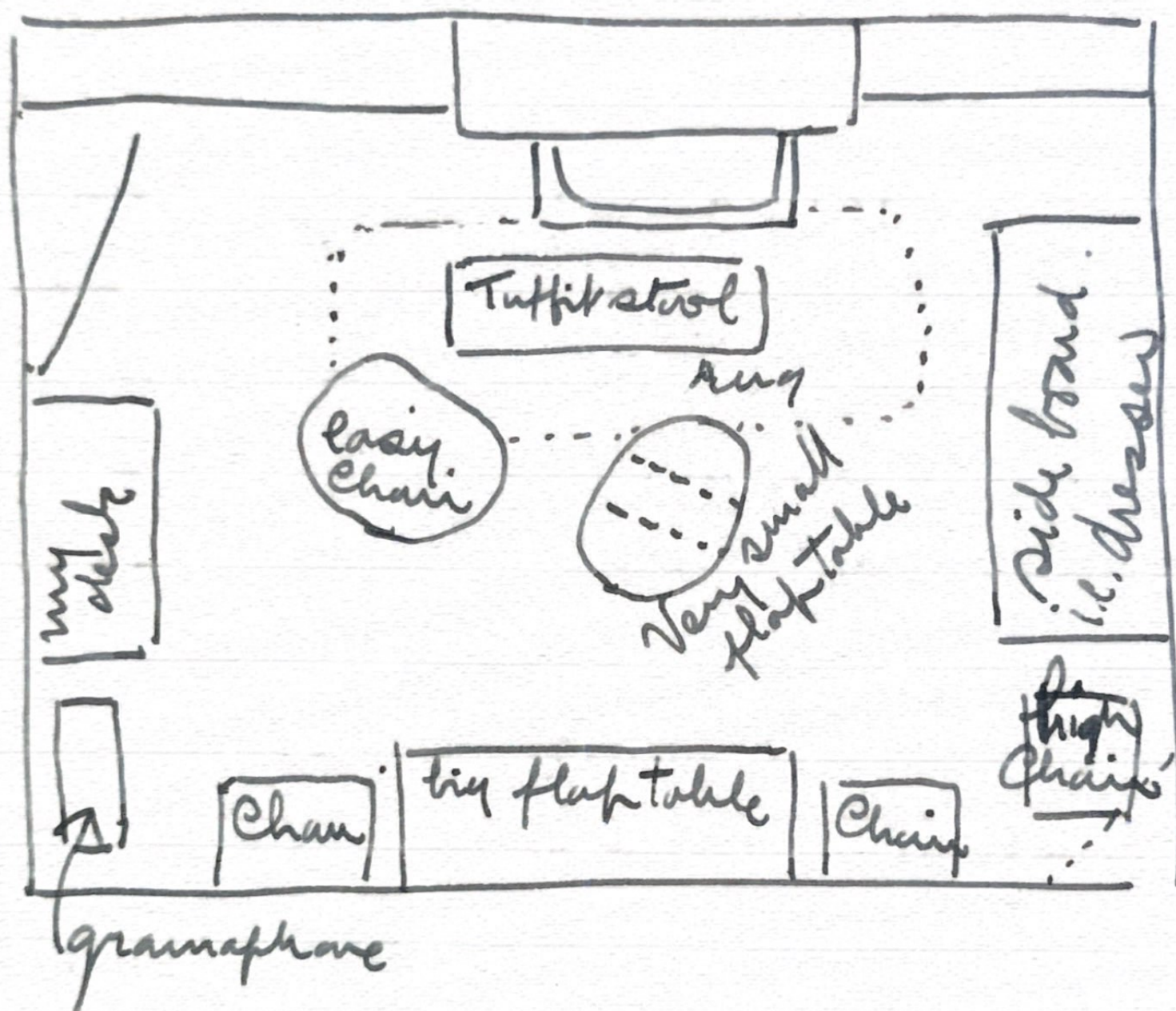


table - and the bell hanging from
